What Should He or She Be Doing?

Don't! Don't! Don't!

Do you ever find yourself saying "don't do this" or "don't do that" over and over and over to your child? "Don't" tells what not to do, but doesn't let the child know what *to do*. Instead of saying "don't," ask yourself what he/she should be doing and then tell them! Instead of "don't kick your sister" say "keep your feet to yourself." Instead of "don't play with your food" say "eat your potatoes." Rather than "don't run" say "walk" or "slow down."

Don't delay...uh...I mean, try it! ◆







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Fences and Gates

Please do not allow your child to climb the fence—the fence is designed to keep children safe and not for their climbing enjoyment. You may need to remind your child that Bunnell House rules are the same whether you are present or not.

Please always close gates behind you when entering or exiting the kitchens or playground. **Children must always be accompanied by an adult into and out of the kitchens.** This is required by State of Alaska Child Care Licensing.

Remember, too, it is our policy that adults only operate gates.

Children who will be 4-years-old on or before September 1, 2018 will move to Pammy's classroom after our August closure.

Immunizations

If you are asked for an updated copy of your child's immunization record, please provide it promptly. In accordance with State of Alaska regulations, we are required to exclude children lacking up-to-date immunizations.

If your child has turned five or will be turning five, it's time for 5-year-old immunizations.

Late Pick Up Fees

Late pick up fees are \$5 per minute. Fees will be added to your account based on the time recorded when you check out your child. •

Extra Clothing

Check your child's cubby — many children are missing a full set of extra clothing.

If your child does have extra clothes, please make sure they still fit and are appropriate for the current weather. A turtleneck and fleece pants may be too warm on a summer day.

Also, please provide a light jacket or sweater for cool mornings and rain gear for wet days. We spend as much time as possible outside!

Footwear

Your child needs both inside and outside shoes for Bunnell House.

Outside shoes must be appropriate for active play, including climbing, jumping, pedaling, and running.

We discourage sandals or other open shoes because they come off easily and fill up with pea gravel quickly.

Rain boots should be used on wet days only to avoid hot, uncomfortable little feet.
